## Historical Appraisal:.

There used to be an ancient temple in the sixth year of Daoguang reign at the location of the Buddhist Monastery, but it had long been abandoned. In the 1950s, some villagers moved here. They made a living by farming. They worshiped the Great Sage Buddha in a small temple, but the condition of the temple is very poor, so in the 1960s, the villagers raised money and built Nam On Buddhist Monastery.

Surrounding Environment: Lam Tei Irrigation Reservoir is located in the middle and upper reaches of Dan Kwai Hang, north of Kau Keng Shan, Tuen Mun. A memorial tablet next to the steps at the east end of the main dam of Lam Tei Reservoir identified.

### Historical Appraisal:

Lam Tei Reservoir (known as Lo Fu Hang Reservoir at the time), construction of the reservoir began in the winter of 1955, and it was completed on the same day as Hung Shui Hang Reservoir in 1957. The reservoir was opened on 28 March 1957 by Sir Alexander Grantham. There is a memorial tablet built next to the steps at the east end of the main dam of Lam Tei Reservoir to commemorate it.

Associated historical/cultural events or individuals:. Sir Alexander Grantham



### Surrounding Environment:

Located at the hill slope to the east of Wah Fat Street. The Caritas Li Ka Shing Care and Attention Home is located north of the site. The Maclehose Trail Section 10 is at the east and the Wah Fat Playgound is located to the southwest of the site.

The site was constructed on a hill slope range from around +36mPD to +55.9mPD with 10 terraces. The retaining walls of the terrace were constructed with granite blocks.

### Historical Appraisal:

According to internet source, the site was established in late 1950s and used as a school known as Tuen Mun Shun Sang Primary School (屯門信生小學) mainly for the children of fishermen living around the area. The information is supported by a foundation stone dated 1 June 1959 of a building structure at Terrace 3.

Review of 1963 old map identified the site comprised 6 terraces. Only Terrace 3 was built with some building structures.

Review of 1970 old map identified building structures were built on Terrace 4 to 6. The information is supported by a foundation stone dated 1968 of a building structure at Terrace 6.

According to internet source, the school was operated by Christian organisation until the 1980s.

The site was then converted into a campsite known as the Hong Kong Girl Guide Tuen Mun Campsite (香港 女童軍鍾紫燕渡假營) and opened on 28 July 1988.

The site is currently abandoned.


